Grand Central has recently entered into a contract with Network Rail to operate services on the WCML between Blackpool North and London Euston.

The contract currently contains one key restriction, as directed by ORR, in relation to the firm rights awarded, as follows:

• For one Wednesday every 8 weeks the rights for one London to Blackpool path are contingent rather than firm.

This application seeks to remove this restriction from the existing contract.

The proposal will require updates to be made to 'Table 2.1 Passenger Train Slots' in Schedule 5 of Grand Central's North West Track Access Agreement dated 24th October 2019.

Network Rail is unable at this stage to support the proposal for this change. Grand Central has bid into the May 20 timetable for a later slot which it believes resolves the previous conflict with the Network Measurement Train (NMT). Grand Central expects this proposal will be rejected owing to bids from other operators that would conflict with the proposed path.

We will continue to work with Network Rail to resolve this issue and find a timetable solution allowing Grand Central to operate all its Wednesday services without restriction, in line with its firm rights for all other Wednesdays.

Grand Central is seeking to remove the restriction contained within its current track access contract which states that for one Wednesday every 8 weeks the rights for one London to Blackpool path are contingent rather than firm.

Unless we can agree a path for this train every Wednesday, passengers will be offered an inconsistent and unbalanced timetable. In ability to operate this northbound service will also result in a corresponding up service being cancelled.

This current arrangement puts Grand Central at commercial risk if it is unable to provide a consistent service to passengers throughout the week.

Grand Central's original proposal was for a service to operate in the 1533 slot from London Euston. However, this service conflicts with the Network Measurement Train which warranted the restriction included in the Track Access Contract.
Grand Central has continued to evaluate the opportunities and for May 2020 has bid for an alternative path departing London Euston at 1549. This would require another operator's service to be flexed by 3 minutes but recover all this time during its journey. This would allow Grand Central to operate its Wednesday service without restriction.
