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PR08 timetable

Dear Paul

- 1. I am writing to update you on our timetable for carrying out the 2008 periodic review (PR08).
- 2. As you know, we formally started PR08 in August 2005, when we published our first consultation document. In that document, and also in our initial assessment of Network Rail's revenue requirement and financial issues consultation published in December 2005, we included our evolving timetable for PR08.
- 3. We have made two main changes to the timetable previously published. We would like to inform you of these, so that you can take the changes into account in your own planning and engagement in the review. The changes are:
 - we will bring forward our November 2006 assessment of Network Rail's initial strategic business plan (SBP) to September 2006; and
 - we will bring forward our access charges review notice from April 2007 to February 2007 and consolidate it with other material, in particular our statement on the HLOS/SOFA requirements to DfT/Transport Scotland, instructions to Network Rail for its SBP and draft determinations on the long term signalling review.

Initial SBP: options and issues

- 4. This document will contain our emerging assessment of the initial SBP. The document will set out key issues and questions that we want to engage stakeholders on as part of our assessment of the initial SBP. We will consult on this document (for three months) with the consultation period closing in December 2006, which will allow us to take account of responses in the February 2007 document.
- 5. As part of the consultation process we will hold an industry workshop in October 2006.

Advice to Ministers and Framework for Setting Access Charges

- 6. We are bringing forward our formal access charges review notice required under Schedule 4A of the Railways Act 2005, originally earmarked for April 2007, to February 2007. This will give the Secretary of State for Transport and Scottish Ministers a period of notice to provide us with their high-level output specifications (HLOSs) and statements of the public funds available (SOFAs). We are not changing the previously stated date, of July 2007, for the HLOSs/SOFAs to be provided to us.
- 7. Alongside the notice, we also will be including in this document:
 - our full assessment of Network Rail's initial SBP, taking into account Network Rail's September 2006 scenarios, responses to our consultation and outcomes from the October 2006 workshop;
 - our decisions on the incentive, charges and financial framework for CP4;
 - clarification of our requirements for the HLOSs/SOFAs;
 - information requirements for Network Rail's October 2007 SBP submission; and
 - draft determinations on the long term signalling review.
- 8. The revised timetable is included in Annex A to this letter.

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9. I am copying this letter to Tim Wellburn/Mark Lambirth (DfT), Jonathan Pugh (Transport Scotland), Alec McTavish (ATOC), Graham Smith (Rail Freight Operators Association), Robin Shaw (Transport Wales), Richard Wallace (TfL) and Roy Wicks (PTEG). We will also be placing a copy of this letter on our website.
