AMENDMENTS TO THE SEPTEMBER 2022 DELAY ATTRIBUTION PRINCIPLES AND RULES

- 1. The Office of Rail and Road (ORR) has today approved the proposals below to amend the September 2022 Delay Attribution Principles and Rules (DAPR) submitted to it by the Delay Attribution Board (DAB) on 14 February 2022:

 - DAB P357 Issues caused by Remote Condition Monitoring alerts
 - DAB P358 Ongoing delays caused by underlying fleet issues
 - DAB P359 Removal of codes FK/FS Rewording of FJ.
 - DAB P360 Use of Code OU
 - DAB P361 Operator-owned trains used for Network Rail activities
 - GBRf P004 Removal of code AE
 - GBRf P005 Clarification on freight driver errors
 - NR P217 Mitigation that proves unnecessary in retrospect
 - NR P218 Clarification on heat-related speed restrictions
 - NR P220 New code XJ for extreme heat
 - NR P221 Clarification on use of code IW
 - NR P222 Codes relating to speed restrictions.
- 2. The amendments to the DAPR will take effect on 1 April 2023.
- 3. ORR has approved the amendments because it is satisfied that they provide greater clarity in the delay attribution process.
