PROSECUTION

On 2nd November 2016, an employee of the defendant was carrying out planned preventative maintenance work of bridges and structures along the northern line. Prior to the work being carried out, a site visit should have been conducted including the taking of photographs and surveying of issues such as access and working at height by the site person in charge. These issues were not considered and the subsequently produced work method statements were generic. Overall there was no proper planning, no adequate supervision and as a result, the employee fell approximately 14 feet and suffered multiple broken bones and a punctured lung. The defendant plead guilty and accepted that it did not

take all reasonably practicable steps to ensure work at height was carried out safely
