Consultation pursuant to an Appeal under Regulation 32 of the Railways (Access, Management and Licensing of Railway Undertakings) Regulations 2016 concerning access to the HS1 network

ORR has received an appeal from Eurostar International Limited (EIL) pursuant to Regulation 32 of the Railways (Access, Management and Licensing of Railway Undertakings) Regulations 2016 ("the Regulations"). Having reviewed the information submitted, ORR has decided to accept the appeal for consideration under Regulation 32 and to commence the formal appeal process.

This appeal will be determined under the statutory framework set out in Regulation 32. The HS1 Criteria and Procedures provide relevant HS1-specific context but do not replace the statutory appeals process.

Scope of the Appeal

ORR considers that the appeal concerns the process followed by HS1 Limited (London St. Pancras Highspeed, "LSPH") in relation to the allocation of infrastructure capacity on the HS1 network.

If any party considers that this description does not accurately reflect the subject matter of the appeal, it should notify ORR promptly.

Requests for Representations and Relevant Information

Pursuant to Regulation 32(5), ORR is inviting comments and relevant information from the parties to the appeal and any other relevant parties identified by ORR. The purpose of this process is to ensure that ORR has before it all information necessary to determine the appeal fairly and in accordance with its statutory duties.

ORR has therefore issued this letter and provided a copy of the appeal to LSPH, as the respondent, EIL, as the applicant, and to the following relevant parties:

- VTE OpCo Limited;
- SE Trains Limited;
- East Midlands Railway;
- Trenitalia France/FS Group;
- Gemini Trains;
- Evolyn;
- Eurotunnel;
- SNCF Réseau;
- Infrabel; and
- ProRail.

Any representations and supporting evidence should be submitted by no later than **2 October 2026**. Further consultations will then take place as outlined in the timetable below.

Representations should address:

- the issues raised by the appeal;
- any relevant factual background;
- the process followed and decisions made by LSPH in relation to the matters under appeal;
- any effect on existing or prospective access rights, capacity allocation or operation of the HS1 network; and
- any other matters considered relevant to ORR's determination.

ORR also invites LSPH, as the respondent, to provide a list of any relevant parties not included above, without delay.

Secretary of State Consultation

As required by Regulation 32(6), ORR is also now consulting the Department for Transport (DfT) to invite any observations it wishes to provide on behalf of the Secretary of State relevant to the matters under appeal. In accordance with Regulation 32(7), ORR will consult such parties as we consider appropriate on any representations submitted by or on behalf of the Secretary of State before we make or issue any decisions or directions.

Further Information

ORR may request further information from any party where necessary to determine the appeal. Where additional information is received which raises matters on which other parties should have an opportunity to comment, ORR may invite further submissions.

Publication and information sharing

Your representations will be copied to EIL and published on our website, unless confidentiality is requested and accepted by ORR.

As set out in our guidance, in considering any request for non-disclosure, we generally apply the test set out in section 71(2) of the Railways Act 1993. That test requires us to have regard to the need for excluding from publication, so far as that is practicable, any matter which relates to the affairs of an individual or specifically to the affairs of a particular body where publication of that matter would or might "...in the opinion of [ORR], seriously and prejudicially affect the interests..." of that individual or body. If you believe that any information in your representations should be excluded, you will need to explain when submitting those representations how this meets the criteria under section 71(2) of the Railways Act 1993.

Consistent with ORR's published appeals process, ORR has published the submitted Form R32 on our website, will publish this letter, and invites comments from any other party not listed above which considers itself to be a relevant party in line with the timetable set out below. Any comments received will be considered alongside the formal submissions of the relevant parties listed above.

ORR intends to proceed in accordance with the following timetable. This timetable assumes prompt and complete submissions of representations and consultation responses by all parties.

ORR may amend this timetable if it considers that this is necessary to ensure a fair determination of the appeal.

Decision

Following consideration of all representations and evidence received, ORR will issue a determination setting out its conclusions and any directions made under the Regulations. The determination will be provided to the applicant and respondent and, subject to any confidentiality considerations, published by ORR.
