PR13: consultation on contractual wording for EC4T cost reconciliation

Purpose

The purpose of this letter is to consult you on proposed principles and contractual wording for the cost reconciliation for charges for electric current for traction (EC4T) as part of the 2013 periodic review (PR13).

The aim of the proposed changes to the cost reconciliation formula is to better reflect tariff structure including EC4T delivery charges.
