Recommendation 3

The intent of this recommendation is that the maintenance arrangements for steam locomotives operated by West Coast Railway Company should be consistent and in accordance with the provisions of its safety management system.

West Coast Railway Company should review and improve its safety management system to take account of the need for assurance that the standards of maintenance work carried out on locomotives owned and/or operated by the company are adequate, consistent and subject to monitoring and supervision independent of those doing the work.

Previously reported to RAIB

1. On 11 June 2015 we reported to RAIB that the status of recommendation 3 was 'Implementation ongoing'. We did, however, note that West Coast Railways (WCR) compliance with an Improvement Notice (IN) served on 20 May 2015 requiring it to review the documentation within its Safety Management System (SMS) to ensure it is robust would meet the intention of this recommendation.

ORR decision

2. ORR inspectors have met with WCR and confirmed that it has satisfied the requirements outlined within the IN. Whilst ORR intends to follow up WCR's response to the IN via further inspection work to confirm that the revised SMS works in practice, it is content that the intention of the recommendation – the review and improvement of WCR's SMS - has been met.

3. After reviewing information received ORR has concluded that, in accordance with the Railways (Accident Investigation and Reporting) Regulations 2005, WCR has:

- taken the recommendation into consideration; and
- has taken action to implement it.
